I thank you for publishing my letters about my Dad, Lt. Col. William J. Brophy, and the UFO recovery on the McDonald Ranch, July 3-4 (night) 1947, which killed two 7-ft tall blond Nordics.

Your father's UFO sighting in 1941 in China is very interesting to me, as my Dad told me those tall blond aliens operated in the Tibet area as well as Puerto Rico,

where my friend Jorge Martín has reported them at Lake Cartagena and El Yunque National Forest.

The tall blonds are related genetically to the Irish and the Basques. Jorge Martín tells me Lake Cartagena is the area in Puerto Rico where the Basques live.

The UFO on the McDonald Ranch was recovered by Air Corps personnel from Alamogordo A.A.F. in New Mexico. Col. Paul F. Helmlek and Lt. Col. Harold R. Turner were in charge of the recovery.

My reason for writing to you is that a friend who is a long time FSR subscriber (Sue Waller) loaned me a copy of your Spring 2003 issue to read Margaret R Buckingham's article. Sue thought I wouldn't agree with Margaret's views, and she was correct! Margaret has combined facts with inaccurate interpretations to arrive at a totally incorrect conclusion. I will make two initial points:-

1. Margaret argues that humanity's negative excesses are encouraged by and are for the benefit of those on other worlds. So Margaret does not blame rapists, muggers, murderers, liars and cheats for their appalling behaviour, as it is all due to these nasty negativity-consuming Aliens, is it!?!
