ABSTRACT

A chronological presentation of summaries of 37 reports during 1974 in which humanoid beings, some of them described as UFO occupants, were reported, with map, tables and graphs showing distributions of various special patterns, and a summary of other special features.

Ted Bloecher is Co-chairman, with David Webb, of MUFON's Humanoid Study Group, which grew out of last year's MUFON Symposium at Akron. The HSG catalog now contains a listing of over a thousand specific references to humanoid and occupant reports, many of these being case files of first-hand information.

This catalog of 1974 humanoid reports represents case material collected up to April, 1975. Additional references will doubtless have surfaced by the time of the MUFON Symposium in July, 1975, when this paper will be available. Inclusion of case material does not reflect endorsement by MUFON or by the Humanoid Study Group: the catalog lists all available references for the period, regardless of their individual merit. Obviously some of these cases are less credible than others; worse yet, for most of them we still lack adequate information to arrive at any firm conclusion so that final judgments of their truth or falsity must be suspended until more conclusive data are available.

Because of space limitations, all of the cases had to be given in abbreviated summary form. Organization follows that used by David Webb in his report, 1973 -- The Year of the Humanoids (1). A dozen new 1973 case references have come to light since the publication of Webb's report; a listing of these, with references, is included in an addendum to this catalog. The format, like Webb's, is designed to be compatible with that used by Dr. David Saunders in his computerized catalog of 70,000 UFO references (UFOCat).

A new classification is being introduced here for the first time, in an effort to make explicit the degree of association between the reported entities and their "vehicles," or UFOs. It is an important relationship that has been ill-defined, or ignored, in the past and should be useful in evaluating all reports describing humanoids and UFO occupants. This classification is set forth in Table 1.

FORMAT OF CASE ABSTRACTS

The first line of each case summary gives, in order, the Case Identification Number, which includes the last two digits of the year, then the number in chronological sequence; the Date (month and day); the Local Times, by 24-hour clock; the Locale (town and state for Domestic cases; town and country for Foreign); Number of Witnesses, and Witnesses' Names (last name only); if confidential, indicated only by the last name initial and dashes, followed by

(C); or, if name is unknown altogether, a blank space. At the far right of the first line, the abbreviation for the witnesses' immediate environs is given, e.g. in a house, "Hse," in a car, "Veh," etc.

The second line of the case heading specifies the Type of Association between entity and object (see Table 1), followed by abbreviated entries for the duration ("Br" means "brief," "Sv" means "several" minutes, etc.), Number of Objects, and Number of Entities (e.g., "5 Min, 1 Obj, 3 Ents"). At the right, "special features" are noted by code. This covers certain physical, or special, features that are found in many close-encounter experiences, such as electromagnetic effects, animal reactions, physiological effects on witnesses and traces left at landing sites. Table 2 lists the coded abbreviations used to designate these features.

Other symbols used in the summary headings include the hyphon ("-") or minus sign, the plus sign ("+"), and the plus-minus symbol ("+"). The hyphen, used to the left of an entry, signifies "under," "fewer" or "Tesser" than or, as used in the date column, "earlier" than. Used to the left of the entry for "environs (e.g., "-Veh"), it signifies that the observer was not continually in that particular place throughout the duration of the experience (i.e., he got out of his car, or left the house). The plus sign on the left of the entry signifies "at least," "greater" or "later" than, or "over." In the Witness column, the number of witnesses listed signifies the number of witnesses who saw an entity; a plus to the left of that number signifies that others may have seen a UFO or other objects at the same time. The plus-minus sign indicates an approximate quantity, date or time (e.g., "+Derry, N.H.", or near the town of Derry). These devices are a combination of, or variation on, methods used by other researchers as a short-hand means of categorizing certain data bits; if they seem vague, or arbitrary, or confusing, we apologize, with the hopes that our critics can devise a more acceptable, and standardized, approach.

We would like to thank the many MUFON members and contributors who provided material contained in this 1974 catalog, as well as for earlier case material. We would like to see the MUFON Humanoid Study Group expand and increase the input of useful case data in its files; to do this we must rely upon the continued interest and support of all MUFON researchers and investigators. With the introduction of MUFON's new Field Investigator's Manual, prepared by Raymond Fowler, we now have a standardized guide for the investigation and reporting of humanoid cases that should significantly increase the amount and type of information this kind of report can provide.

THE CASE SUMMARIES

Driving toward Warneton (along French-Belgian frontier), witness experienced failure of engine, lights and radio, then saw a landed UFO 150 m. away in field. Shaped like WWI British helmet, object was 7-10 m. wide, stood on 3 legs and had patches of orange luminescence, with a white light underneath. Two beings were seen coming from direction of the object, walking slowly and stiffly toward car. The shorter (1.2-1.3 m.) had horizontal rings around torso and a round helmet with a large circular face-plate, showing a pear-shaped, greyish head with no hair, round "marble-like" eyes, a rudimentary nose, and slit-like, lipless mouth. He held an object like a short thick ruler with pointed tip, aimed at car. Taller being wore a cubical helmet transparent at front, showing face identical

with the other's, but with small, rectangular box under chin; his suit was dull metallic grey of one-piece coverall type, including gloves and heavy, pointed boots. He wore a black belt with luminous disc in front and a diagonal "Sam Browne" strap from belt to shoulder, with vertical row of "buttons" on each side of chest. Both beings had long arms. Interior of both helmets appeared to be illuminated. Third entity stood guard near the object.

The two beings approached to within 4 meters of the car and the taller opened and closed his mouth; witness felt a slight shock at the back of his head and heard a low-pitched, modulated sound. The two suddenly wheeled around and walked swiftly back to the UFO, which now pulsated an electric blue. Beings boarded, tripod legs withdrew; it rose slightly, hovered, then ascended rapidly at 60-degree angle. A car approached whose driver had also seen the object and the beings. Driving off, the witness continued to get poor reception on the car radio. Duration was about 20 minutes.

74-02 Jan 8 0313 Springfield, Ohio 1 J----(C) Veh
Type A: 5 Min, 1 Obj, 5 Ents E-M
Investigator: Leonard Stringfield (CUFOS)

Leaving his job, witness's car lights dimmed and motor stalled. He saw multicolored lights descend just yards in front of car, followed by the appearance of a blinding white oval of light 6 ft in diameter, apparently the interior of the object. Five small (3-4 ft) occupants observed, sitting to one side on high-backed seats; they wore bright-colored robes and each had long brown hair reaching to the floor. Their faces could not be recalled by the witness. The surroundings and car interior were brightly illuminated. After 5 minutes, the interior light was extinguished and the object ascended rapidly with another display of colored lights. A maintenance man on the premises had noticed a failure on his "pager" radio four times between 7 and 10 p.m., although no lights or UFOs were then observed.

74-03 Jan 17 Night Shores Community, Tenn. 1 Swanner Hse Type F: Unknown, 0 Obj, 0 Ents C-I Investigators: W.A. Darbro; Stanley Ingram (Pulaski <u>Citizen</u>)

The witness was awakened by a high-frequency buzzing. A voice inside his head then told him that the beings responsible were from an Earth-like planet always behind the sun from us. (Subject in this case is a "repeater," with several sightings in Fall, 1973; see also Cases 74-04 and 74-05.)

74-04 Feb 4 1800 Shores Community, Tenn. 1 Swanner -Hse Type A: 1 Min, 1 Obj, 2 Ents E-M Investigators: Same as 74-03

UFO shaped like wooden shoe with transparent dome atop seen outside witness's house, hovering 6 ft over garden. Emitted buzzing sound and disrupted TV reception. Domed area glowed soft white, and heads and shoulders of 2 humanoid occupants were seen within; UFO had one large light in front, two at rear. Buzzing stopped, UFO made turn and slowly left area silently. (See also 74-03 and 74-05.)

74-05 Feb 9 Shores Community, Tenn. 1 Swanner
Type B: +45 Min, 1 Obj, 2 Ents C-I, 0-B
Investigators: Same as 74-03 and 74-04

-Obj

Previously contacted telepathically (cf. 74-03), witness was now invited by two "men" to ride in UFO. In minutes they passed over San Francisco, then Hawaii; round trip took 45 minutes. Their purpose: to warn of destruction of solar system by atomic bombs. Their appearance: 4-5 ft tall, long pointed chins, small eyes, ears and nose, and high foreheads. Lifespans: 125 to 175 years. Clothing white, tight-fitting coverall type, "expensive-looking." Witness instructed to inform the public, claims "proof" he cannot now reveal. (See also Cases 74-03 and 74-04.)

74-06 Mar 1 ±2000 Vesta Community, Va. +2 Plasters-Clifton -Veh
Type C: -1 Min, 1 Obj, 1 Ent G-T, S-T
Investigators: Nancy Lindsey (reporter); George Fawcett

Three witnesses saw nearby hillside lit up by bright yellow light; redluminous object seen ascending from site. Two male observers drove in truck to area, saw silhouette of "big, tall, heavy set man" approach from lighted area. They called out, got no answer, jumped in truck and fled in alarm. Light disappeared a few minutes later. Next day patches of charred vegetation were found at hillside site, covering large area. Others reported seeing strange lights on same night, and hearing peculiar noises.

74-07 Mar 21 0215 <u>+</u>Valdehijaderos, Spain 1 Iglesias -Veh
Type C: Sv Min, 2 Objs, 2 Ents E-M
Investigators: Don Angel Gil (reporter); Vincent Rico Gil

Truckdriver observed blinding white light on road; at 200 m. his lights and Diesel motor went out. Faintly luminous object, wider than the road (10 m.) and with no visible openings, rested on three half-meter legs; second non-luminous object hovered nearby. Two 6 ft beings appeared wearing closefitting, metallic-surfaced coveralls. Facial features could not be discerned. They looked at witness, gestured to each other, and one pointed at him; the two then disappeared around the right side of the UFO, which rose with a humming sound. The driver passed on, but looking back, he saw that the object had again landed on the road. (See also next case.)

74-08 Mar 21 2330 <u>+</u>Valdehijaderos, Spain 1 Iglesias -Veh Type C: <u>+</u> 10 Min, 3 Objs, 4 Ents A-A, E-M, G-T, P-E Investigators: Same as 74-07

At same locale as earlier, witness saw 3 objects on ground. Truck lights and motor killed, as before. No openings seen in UFO on road but four men now appeared and approached, at which the driver got out of truck and fled. They followed, gaining. After running some distance, he jumped into drainage ditch and hid; the four searched area but did not find him. Shortly after, he returned to his truck; 3 objects still there, and engine would not start. The four figures reappeared, gestured to each other, and disappeared around UFO in road, which then rose with a loud whistling sound; the truck now started normally. After passing, driver again stopped and saw that third object had re-landed; he returned on foot and saw, from distance of 8-9 m., the men digging at roadside with several implements. He could not make out facial features even at this



close distance. After 3 minutes, he crept back to his truck. Returning several days later with Civil Guard officer, traces were found in roadbed and on embankment. (See also Case 74-07.)

74-09 Apr +10 0015 +Whitehouse, Ohio 1 S----(C) -Veh
Type E: -10 Min, 0 Obj, 1 Ent C-I, E-M
Investigators: Earl Neff, Larry Moyers

Observer left work just after midnight, was driving toward Waterville on Rte 64, when motor and lights died. Got out of car and noticed car behind him stop; driver, normally dressed and grey-haired, "like man in Cadillac advertisement," approached and offered witness "proof" by dematerializing rock with a small hand-held implement; told witness to "save" his marriage, and promised subsequent "contact."

This "contact" occurred one night after meeting of witness with local friend and contactee, as though in response to his spoken request for "proof" at that meeting.

74-10 Apr -30 -2000 Altamont, New York +3 Currie-Curtis
Type A: -2 Min, 1 Obj, 1 Ent A-R, S-T
Investigator: Ernie Jahn (NICAP)

Mrs. Currie and daughter saw bright light on road a few hundred ft away; neighborhood dogs were barking. Approaching, they saw oval-shaped object with windows around top from which came a brilliant golden light. They saw a silhouette of an "undefinable shape" moving about inside UFO. Mrs. Curtis was summoned to confirm, then Mr. Curtis; by that time UFO was ascending and he saw only rising object. Next day, large burned area 60 ft in diameter found at site.

74-11 May 7 2100 Coatesville, Pa. 1 Roffe
Type B: Sv Min, 1 Obj, 3 Figs C-U
Investigator: Unknown

Observer, a nurse's aid, was walking from one hospital building to another when she saw a disc descending; four legs emerged and the object landed atop the roof. A ramp, or ladder, emerged from the bottom, down which three beings climbed backwards. They had long heads and arms with clawed hands, short legs, and grey skin. They spoke amongst themselves in high, squeaky voices. This roof-top tableau was well-lit by illumination from dome on object. One being turned and saw the witness watching; the three then re-entered the object, which took off over nearby trees, agitating them noticeably.

74-12 May 11 2045 Chingford (Essex), Eng. 2 King-Vinten Type D: 30 Min, 0 Obj, 2 Ents Investigator: Norman Oliver

Near dusk 2 witnesses saw through binoculars (8x30, 10x50) at about half-mile distance a female figure with long blonde (or white) hair and long black dress, and featureless face. Figure stood motionless for 10 min., when second black-gowned figure was seen moving among trees. First figure disappeared, then reappeared 50 yds from original position, where it was again motionless for



about 10 minutes, and then vanished. Two children had previously been found dead at site. (See also 74-13.)

74-13 May 11 2135 Chingford (Essex), Eng. 2 King-Vinten Type C: 25 Min, 1 Obj, 2 Ents Investigator: Same as 74-11

Upon returning to site, two witnesses saw through binoculars two more figures, this time dressed in white; one was motionless, the other "darting about making very quick movements," but showing no leg movements, as if gliding rather than running. At this point a red-lighted UFO was seen rising slowly over treetops in same direction; after 5 minutes it moved off passing almost directly over witnesses, making "weird throbbing, similar to ship's sonar." Had central white light and 2 blinking lights near edge, as well as vertically-revolving bluish light. Object showed central red light and two blinking white lights as it moved off. Vinten took photo; reproduction unavailable, but drawing shows lens shaped object with central bulge. (See Case 74-12.)

74-14 May 20 0030 Hampton Beach, N.H. 1 P-----(C)
Type B: + 10 Min, 1 Obj, 1 Ent G-T
Investigator: John Oswald

Witness, swimming at midnight, saw disc-shaped object approach over ocean, landing on beach 70-80 yds away. Domed above and below with central rim, approx 50 ft in diameter, object stood on four legs; several lights observed on body. Object gave off heat and humming or pulsating sound. A hatch folded down and ramp slid out; motor-like noise accompanied it. A human-like figure 6 ft or more in height, dressed head to foot in light-colored coverall, stood on ramp. Two hoses ran from jaw area to back of head, with one hose running down back. Figure stepped briefly out on sand, then re-entered the object, which ascended and moved off in the direction it had arrived. The witness searched landing site and found "deep rose-colored paste and thick liquid" in four deep landing marks; also a spot of red where the hatch had opened. Traces had been effaced by tide by morning. This witness, who had a previous landing report in 1972, was known to have lied on earlier occasions; there is reason to suspect this report of being a hoax.

Motorcyclist coasting on road saw 7 ft human-like figure covered entirely by "stainless-steel-colored" suit, wrinkled except for the head, which was shaped like a vertical football, and "skin-tight," obscuring facial features. Upon detecting witness, the figure "half-squatted" briefly, then took 3 large steps and vanished in woods. Three footprints were later found at site.

74-16 May 26 -Dawn <u>+</u>Mitchell Caverns, Calif. l Susedik -Mob Hse Type C: Unknwn, l Obj, 8 Ents A-E, A-S, C-I, M-L, O-B, P-E Investigators: Idabel Epperson (MUFON)

Witness, asleep in "camper," was awakened by a humming sound and pulsating light; tried to call wife and children but was immobilized. Saw four "pinwheels of odd-shaped colored lights," red, orange, yellow and blue-green, but could not recall any further details; woke two hours later than usual in morning, with eyes bloodshot and body aching. Impressions of having been in object, but memory lapse blocked details. He had observed UFO earlier that evening. After this, witness claims to have become a prolific inventor. After hypnosis, at later date, witness recalled being in UFO and described row of gyroscopes along inner wall--"the pinwheels of colored lights energized these to form artificial gravity field." Crew of 8 men, 7 wearing maroon "foil-type" uniforms, one a pale-blue "soft" uniform. Witness's eyes were examined with magnifying glass; he also saw "a nebulae in various colors to show concentrations of metals and minerals," a color close-up of Saturn on a coil-edged screen, and 3 "black reclining-type high-backed seats at the control panel." Witness believes timeregression hypnosis, to be done in March 1975, will uncover further memories. He is a repeater, having seen UFOs on a number of earlier occasions; he anticipates further "contacts."

74-17 May 31 -0230 Umvuma, Rhodesia 2 -Veh Type C: -1 Min, 1 Obj, 1 Ent E-M, M-D, P-E Investigator: Carl Van Vlierden (MUFON)

Couple driving from Salisbury to Durban observed a strange being, taken first for a policeman, along the road 6 miles south of Umvuma. The figure had a small "box" in hands, and his "uniform" was "metallic" and shiny--"it didn't look natural." A light was observed immediately afterward in the distance. During the remainder of the trip there were additional sightings and a series of strange physical and psychological effects "quite out of the ordinary," including sensations of "floating" in their vehicle, E-M effects upon its motor and lights, and the possibility of some kind of "time dilation" phenomenon.

74-18 Jun 6 2040 <u>+</u>Warneton, Belgium 1 Veh Type E: Br, 0 Objs, 2 Ents E-M, P-E Investigators: Same as Case 74-01

Encounter was at same place as that of Jan 7 (Case 74-01), and at same time, although this time the sun had not yet set. Witness saw the same two beings as earlier, this time standing along roadside; car casette-player went out as he approached, and engine sputtered. He stopped car alongside beings and again felt the same slight shock at back of head and heard the same modulated sound--the two beings instantly vanished. He looked for object, saw none.

74-19 Jun 14 0430 Medellin, Spain +1 Romero -Veh
Type A: +60 Min, 1 Obj, 3 Ents
Investigator: J.M. Amilibia (reporter)

Witness, 46, driving to father's farm, saw bright light, then a "pot-shaped object" flying rapidly at low altitude (ab 100 m.); the UFO approached and paced vehicle ab 70 m. to the right; when headlights were turned on, UFO approached, and when extinguished, it receded. It hovered above the farmhouse he entered, illuminating area "like day." It rotated as it hovered, with slight back-forth, pendulum motion; no sound was heard. About 10 m. thick, object was surmounted with conical turret emitting a brilliant yellow light. Inside

were "3 men more than 2 m. tall, moving stiffly, with something like helmets on their heads." Object was in view for more than an hour and a half and was seen by others; it departed as sun rose.

74-20 Jun 25 St Cyrille de Wendover, P.Q. +2 L-----(C) Mob Hse Type C: +3 Hrs, 1 Obj, 15 Ents A-R, G-T, P-A Investigators: Wido Hoville, Jean Roy, Marc Leduc, P. Blaquiere

Hearing a "bum-bum" noise, witness looked outside and saw a reddish UFO hovering over a field near trailer; he awakened his wife and, after hearing a buzzing noise, they observed a 6 ft entity approx 15 feet from the window. From another window they saw 3 more of these strange beings, which moved "stiffly" and appeared "robot-like." They appeared to examine an unoccupied adjacent trailer. During the next 3 hrs, the witnesses saw as many as 15 "robots" in line adjacent to a nearby creek, holding this formation more than 5 minutes, then all moving in synchronization. These metallic-looking figures were described as having brightly red-glowing horizontal bars, like toaster elements, across their torsos, and no visible facial features. They appeared to "float" above ground rather than walk; no footprints were later found but investigators discovered and photographed 3 sets of tripod imprints, presumably left by the UFO, on the far side of the creek. Grass in these areas was swept in "nest" fashion; after mowing, this grass was said to grow twice as high as grass nearby. Several flat pieces of a "strange substance of white color" similar to plastic were found where the robots had been seen.

74-21 Jun 25 0200 Corbin Beach (Vashon Is), Wa. 2 Cosby -Hse Type A: -3 Min, 1 Obj, 1 Ent A-R Investigator: George Fawcett

Mrs. Cosby, rising from bed, saw a glow coming from outside their beachfront home and called her husband. Using binoculars they observed a dark cylindrical object displaying 3 bright white lights on one side and two red lights underneath, which lit up water beneath it. A bright beam played on the house. Mrs. Cosby could also see an antenna on the 30-foot object, and the silhouette of a humanoid figure inside. The UFO traveled south, then turned east during the 2-3 minutes in view.

74-22 Jul 9 Bahia Blanca, Argentina 1 Medina Type D: Unkwn, O Obj, 1 Ent P-E Investigator: Unknown

Fashion model saw a strange being ab 2 m. tall "all covered with brilliant scales, like a great iridescent fish;" it stood, like a statue, just watching her, "then it went away." The being's luminescence hurt her eyes and later she found that her eyelashes had been burned off, so that she had to wear false ones.

Head was bald but hair was observed on lower portion of face; no other features on face. turned around at the end of the street and drove back but the figure had vanished. Prior to encounter, witness alleges visit by "extraterrestrial" woman. On 8/25 she and her family saw UFO over their goat farm, and on 8/27, object re-appeared. Running down driveway to meet it, the object descended to ab 15-20 ft and shone bright lights in a circle around her; UFO was cigar-shaped with transparent bottom through which she saw one man and two women; one woman was the same one who visited her earlier, and she smiled. Object took off rapidly as witness's daughter approached.

By morning woman was suffering severe physical symptoms and was hospitalized; she was bleeding from the kidneys and became dehydrated, dropping in matter of weeks from 138 to 90-odd pounds. Under X-ray, she said, her "insides were glowing." She was also found to have a "crease" or "dent" in her skull that was not there prior to her "contact." She claimed to have become especially "psychic" after her experience. The investigator was unable to confirm any record of her hospitalization.

September, altho date is uncertain), while in same area, she heard a voice "inside her head" telling her to turn at a certain intersection, which she Radio and engine quit as four small humanoids, each on a "small surface vehicle" resembling a Roto-Tiller, appeared moving rapidly just above the ground and road surface. One approached car and asked her telepathically to open door; she did not, and all four doors flew open simultaneously. Entity examined the car's interior, requested witness to make certain arm movements and to bend head forward; examined back of neck remarking, "you're different," touching neck with implement that left 5 small puncture marks. She was told that "they" have thousands of ships and have visited Earth for many years, and have examined many people, not all voluntarily. "They" come from a planet named "Omius" or "Omnigus," and their "mother ship" was at that time in Scituate Harbor. She could not touch them because of possible contamination and was told she'd see one of their ships subsequently; and she would suffer from severe headaches for several weeks. She would "not like to look upon their faces." After this encounter she arrived home an hour and a half late. The beings were 4-5 ft tall and had small heads encased in semi-transparent helmets through which she could make out "small, beady, very shiny eyes." The spokesman had a uniform with 2 stripes on upper arm; others had longer stripes on sides above waists. On belt "buckle" was emblem with wavy, vertical lines. Witness felt extreme heat and nausea after either this encounter, or the first; the night following this one, at the same time and place, she saw one of their craft at close range, and car experienced same E-M effects. Incidents upset witness greatly and she told only her husband, who gave the source details in confidence; she had refused to cooperate in any investigation, and has in fact denied that the incidents ever took place, possibly to discourage further inquiries.

At one end of object was a dark area, like a port or door. He suddenly saw a figure on the ground beneath the object, partially obscured by a picket fence; human in shape, it was taller and thinner than normal and appeared to be covered with short, wire-brush-like hair. The figure loped slowly across ground toward the witness, who fired a warning shot; the figure turned and with 20 ft strides headed toward the UFO, which descended and seemed to engulf him in one of his leaps. Witness fired again as object ascended at high speed.

Hunting elk in northern area of park, witness fired at one but saw the bullet leave rifle "in slow motion" and fall in snow 50 ft away. Feeling a "tingle," he turned and saw a "stranger" more than 6 ft tall standing in shade nearby; figure was dressed in a tight-fitting black jumpsuit that covered him from neck to feet. He had coarse hair, like "bristles," standing straight up from head, as well as two antenna-like rods. Small eyes, no eyebrows, and no chin-head just narrowed into neck. Bow-legged; no hands seen, but arms were long and ended in rod-like appendages used to manipulate things. He wore a wide belt; at buckle was a 6-pointed star and a "mysterious yellow emblem."

The being approached and asked Higdon if he was hungry, and tossed him a packet of pills which Higdon swallowed without conscious volition. The entity then pointed his arm at the witness, who suddenly found himself within a transparent, cubical "craft" in company with five elk (yes!) and two additional UFOnauts. He was told they were enroute to their home planet, some 163,000 light-years distant. They put a helmet "with wires sticking out" on his head, and "shortly thereafter" arrived at the apparent destination, where Higdon could see a tall tower "similar to the rotating restaurant atop the Seattle Space Needle." Intense light irritated his eyes and made them water; he was told our sun has the same effect on "them." The next thing he remembered was being back in Medicine Bow National Park, cold, disoriented and in a state of nearhysteria. About 6:30 p.m. he stumbled upon his truck, now three miles from where he had left it and stuck in a mud hole; he sent a call for help over his CB radio, but it wasn't until nearly midnight that Sheriff Ogburn and Deputy Sheriff Tierney found him and towed out his truck. He was in a state of panic, shouting, "They took my elk!" and he was taken to a hospital, his eyes watering and near nervous exhaustion. In the hospital, X-rays showed the disappearance of old TB scars on his lungs. On the same night, before he was found, Higdon's wife and Mr. and Mrs. Don James observed a red-green-white flashing light moving back and forth over the area. Under time-reversion hypnosis by Dr. Sprinkle, Higdon recalled additional features of his trip, including the presence of other "earth people," and the reason the aliens come to earth: hunt and fish for food."

The witness and an airman had seen a UFO at close range three nights prior to this encounter, in the vicinity of Talavera Air Base. Witness returned to the site on night of 11/8 and observed a strange figure on the road outside Badajoz, whose furtive behavior caught his attention. He got out of the car to approach the being, who took evasive action and fled without responding. He wore a dark brown jacket, black trousers, and had a kind of "roman helmet" on his head. Cavero saw no nose, and the eyes appeared "slanted." The body was tall and slender, but he observed no details of the arms or legs.

For several days prior to this encounter there were multiple reports of UFO sightings in Antigo. On Sat. night, 11/16, Mrs. H., proprietor of a local bar and restaurant, had seen with her family a maneuvering light in the sky. Next afternoon, while on duty in the bar, Mrs. H saw a little man of strange appearance, 4.5 ft tall, enter the bar with a kind of "bouncing" gait; he motioned to her to come closer and addressed her in rapid English, saying, "You saw a bright light on Friday night." She corrected him, saying it was Saturday, but he repeated his assertion four times. He was smiling throughout this rapid-fire discourse, showing "a mouthful of white teeth." His eye-level was no higher than the top of the bar, and he wore dark glasses with inch-wide frames, had a dark complexion, and shiny, black hair. His jacket was looselywoven, "like burlap." He continued his monologue and said a meteor was supposed to have landed nearby, adding something unclear to Mrs. H about "Medford," repeating the name several times (there is a town named Medford 100 miles west of Antigo). He spoke so fast that Mrs. H was unable to follow what he said; on perceiving this, he threw his arms into the air and exclaimed, "And the whole world lit up:", wheeled about and stalked out of the door. By the time Mrs. H had recovered from her surprise, the stranger had disappeared. She and several patrons in the bar had not heard any car drive away.

Locale, on Salisbury Plain (SE of Warminster) a popular site for UFO watching, with "hundreds" of observations logged since 1964.

At least 15 others said to have seen the figures in this area, which abounds with sightings; source tells of recent observation of "dynamic, metallic craft" which vanished, then gradually re-appeared in another place. Driving home, 69-year-old witness saw object in opposite lane of highway, slowed down to look; headlights illuminated strange vehicle with curved, transparent front, behind which could be seen a figure from the waist up, with arms

raised over head, as if in terror. Figure seemed "a little taller than a tall man," with long, narrow ears that stuck straight out of sides of head and a square face with hair "sticking straight out from the sides," brown, furry arms and fur, or hair (skin or garment uncertain) on torso. The eyes were large and protruding (according to the newspaper artist's conception). Bosak, frightened by the strange appearance, sped by passing within 6 ft; the car darkened, as if in shadow, and "a kind of whooshing sound" was heard. No traces were found next day.

Noticing a bright light shining in her bedroom, the 82-year-old witness looked outside and saw a "boat-shaped," or oblong, object hovering over a neighboring house. The UFO, 50-60 ft wide, had green and white lights around the lower part, and seemed to be rotating. It gently rose and fell over the house for about 20 minutes and then moved to a new position above a nearby church. A white light shone from 3-4 square windows around the upper portion; atop was a kind of brightly lit area, in which 2 small dark humanoid figures could be seen moving back and forth in "cramped positions," continually gesticulating (or perhaps moving levers) with their arms. The beings, who ignored the witness, were visible only from the waist up. The object remained over the church nearly a half hour, rising and falling slightly, then moved horizontally a short distance and shot upward at high speed.

Multiple reports of a UFO with bright colored lights came about the same time 4 persons called the County Sheriff's dispatcher to report seeing a humanoid figure wearing "a silver and black suit with some sort of helmet" in the Forest Acres area; when observed, the figure would jump into bushes and disappear. The callers sounded sober, according to dispatcher Fred Barnes. Four deputies checked the woods around Forest Road and Barker Ten Mile Road but found nothing. Receipt of additional information on this case is pending as of the writing of this paper.

SUMMARY

The variety of humanoid encounters represented by the 37 cases for 1974 runs the gamut of strangeness, as well as credibility. Some of the cited published references, of course, cannot be vouched for as reliable. There is good reason to suspect that hoaxes may be involved in a few cases; self-delusion probably accounts for several others. In a comprehensive catalog of this type representation is bound to be a kind of "soup-to-nuts" potpourri of case material. We can only apologize for the goats in amongst the sheep; perhaps next year we can offer a catalog of prime mutton. Meantime, we remind ourselves (again and again) that final judgments must be suspended because of insufficient information.



The geographic distribution of 1974 humanoid cases is predominently domestic with 22 cases from the United States and 15 from abroad. This reflects to some degree a slower rate for the surfacing of foreign references, and more complete data could alter the balance considerably. The large number of domestic cases, however, compares well with the distribution for 1973 (see Webb's report). In this country, Ohio ranks highest with four reports; Pennsylvania and Tennessee follow closely with three each, although the latter incidents (cases 3 - 5) are a repeating series of encounters and contacts by the same individual that must be viewed with some skepticism.

Monthly distribution of cases shows peaks in May and December, as illustrated in Figure 1. Hourly distribution, shown in Figure 2, is consistent with earlier patterns of peak activity in the period between 8 p.m. and midnight. Although no specific times were given in nine out of 37 cases, indications are that the balance of these probably fall within the critical period before midnight.

DISTRIBUTION BY MONTHS




Table 3 shows the distribution of various special features among the 37 cases. Vehicles, for example, were involved directly or indirectly in 17 cases, somewhat under 50 percent of the whole; this compares favorably with Webb's figures for 1973 (21 out of 41 cases). Electromagnetic effects were claimed in nine cases that involved vehicles.

Figure 3 illustrates the distribution of types of association between entities and objects (See Table 1). An "inferred" association (Type C) is most often reported (10 cases), and reports in which an "occupant" is seen only within an object (Type A) make up the next highest group, with nine cases. Encounters where beings were seen entering and/or leaving an object (Type B) occur in five instances; and an equal number of cases are found for which there is no object or UFO activity reported (Type E).

Types of beings, notwithstanding size, may be divided into three groups: (1) Human, (2) Humanoid, and (3) "Other." Five domestic and four foreign cases offer information suggesting human or "human-like" entities (cases 6 - 9, 13, 14, 16, 17, and 26). (It is often uncertain whether a witness means human where humanoid is used, and vice versa; adequate information exists in some cases to make a clear distinction.) There seem to be no candidates for "Other," although if more precise data were available, Case 22 might qualify. In three reports, entities are vaguely described as "shadowy" or "indistinguishable" (Cases 10, 21 and 25).



Robot-like creatures have been reported on numerous occasions in the past, and make up a distinctive subdivision in the category that includes humanoids. In contrast to the large number of 1973 cases (nine out of 41), only one example of "robot-like" entities is found for 1974 (Case 20). The single example is interesting because of the numbers of beings reported.

Regarding the dress, or garments, of the entities, the coverall, or close-fitting jumpsuit, is most often reported, and is found in eight cases for 1974 (Cases 1, 5, 7, 8, 14, 18, 27 and 30); metallic or silver-colored uniforms (or coverings) are found in nine reports (Cases 7, 8, 11, 15, 17, 20, 28, 33 and 37); loose-fitting gowns or robes appear in three cases (2, 12 and 13). Helmets of one type or another are described in six cases (1, 18, 19, 27, 31 and 37).

A grey skin color, described in so many older reports, appears in only one case during 1974 (Case 11). Two, or possibly three, cases describe a furry, or hairy, skin texture on at least portions of the body (24, 29 and 35). A "gliding" or "floating" movement by beings is reported in three cases (12, 13 and 20), and unusually long strides or jumps in another two (15 and 29). Disappearing entities turn up twice (33 and 34), reminding the researcher of the classic case of this type, at Marcilly-sur-Vienne, France, on September 30, 1954 (see Jacques Vallee's <u>Passport to Magonia</u>, pp. 68-69).


One potentially significant detail turns up in our sample that has not been noted in such numbers prior to 1974: the predominance of taller beings over shorter ones (see Figure 4). From a group of 25 cases for which there was sufficient information to make comparisons, 14 of them describe beings of six feet or more in height--more than 50 percent of the sample group!

Another unusual feature appears in the 1974 sample in large numbers: the apparent absence of facial features, or at any rate the inability of the witness to recall specific details in situations where they would have been expected to

be apparent. At least nine cases out of 37 show the "no-face" feature (Cases 2, 7, 8, 12, 13, 15, 20, 24 and 27). In several of these cases (15 and 27), there is an indication that there was a sort of tight mask over the being's face; in others, the witness is simply unable to recall features that may, or may not, have been visible (Cases 2, 7 and 8).

"Contact" cases--encounters in which entities engaged witnesses in intelligible communication--account for eight out of 37 cases. Several are very low in credibility (Cases 5, 9 and 26); several others might be significant if more reliable information were available (16 and 27). Two of the more significant reports are also among the more disturbing (to this researcher): the Wyoming abduction of Carl Higdon (Case 31) and the Antigo, Wisconsin, taproom humanoid (Case 33). The extraordinary allegations by the witness in the first case place a heavy strain upon the suspension of one's disbelief, whereas the seeming absurdity of the latter report is no less troublesome; but there is persuasive circumstantial evidence in support of both these cases. In comparison, one views the relatively uncomplicated report from Fairfield, Ohio (case 36), with a sigh of relief.

In conclusion, we find nine of the 1974 humanoid reports of potential significance, based upon available information (or 25 percent of the whole); another half-dozen cases, while being reasonably credible, are less compelling. Lack of information prohibits meaningful conclusions about the balance of reports, and it is this special problem--lack of comprehensive information--to which MUFON investigators can address themselves in the future. We are hopeful that procedures for investigating humanoid cases, outlined in MUFON's new Field Investigator's Manual, will contribute significantly to improvements in the collection of data for these reports. In Dr. J. Allen Hynek's words, ". . . it may yet be discovered that the humanoid cases are the key to the whole problem."
