20 km from Sarikei, Sarawak

Two days after the encounter with the midgets, several schoolboys reported that they had sighted a UFO as big as a classroom in the same plantation. More of the tiny beings were seen near the object.

5. 13 March 1985

Parit Buntar, Perak

Two schoolboys and several adults reported sighting a UFO flying over the town at 6.30 a.m. It was described as saucer-shaped, and five red lights were emitted by it, believed to be coming from its windows. The UFO appeared from the south and moved to the north before disappearing from view.

6. October 1985

Paka, Terengganu

Several schoolchildren claimed that they had encountered 7 human-like entities near the compound of their school. They described the beings as about 4 inches tall and judging from their features they were possibly 6 "men" and one "woman". One of the children who claimed to have touched one of the creatures said he was forced to release its hand when his own hand became itchy suddenly. The children claimed that the "aliens" were hiding beneath a stack of wood near the school. Many people spent several hours removing the pieces of wood, but there were no signs of any such creatures.

7. November 1985

Karak, Pahang

An 18-year-old girl, Norhayati Ahmad, claimed to have sighted a UFO one night while walking home with a friend after having dinner not far from the highway.

8. December 1985

Karak, Pahang

Khairuddin Eidin, 26 years old, reported that he had sighted a UFO as big as an umbrella flying about 10 metres from him. He described the object as metallic, white, and shiny. The incident oc-

curred about 8.30 a.m. as he was riding on his bike along the highway. The UFO was floating about 5 metres above the ground. Several residents and children also watched the object as it rotated and ascended until lost from sight.

9. February 1987 Pekan, Pahang

A schoolteacher, Mustaffa Adam, 52, sighted a UFO hovering some distance away near the school as if in an attempt to find a place to land. He did not tell anyone because he felt no one would believe him. On 25 March 1987 he had a second chance to see the UFO, at about the same time and place, but with over 600 other school-children also witnesses. (see next case.)

10. 25 March 1987

Pekan, Pahang

hundreds of schoolchildren and some teachers sighted a UFO at about 11.00 a.m. not far from the school ground. The UFO was hovering about a quarter mile away and it descended slowly among some trees. It was described as whitish in colour and measured as big as a car.

11. 19 April 1987

Pekan, Pahang

A TV drama director, Habsah Hassan, and several artists sighted a UFO at about 11 p.m. near the school of the earlier incident on 25 March. Othman Zainuddin, one of the TV crew, reported that he was dazed by the UFO, which was very bright and hovering over the area for several minutes before ascending sharply and disappearing from view. They had their camera at the time in the car, but were so shocked that they forgot about it.

SOME RECENT REPORTS FROM THE SPANISH PRESS

J.P. Crivillén (C.E.I., Barcelona), FSR Consultant (Translation from Spanish)

1. UFO Seen Over Valencia (January 3, 1987)

A UFO emitting silvery flashes was seen yesterday morning in the sky over Valencia on the eastern (Mediterranean) coast of Spain, according to a number of newspaper delivery boys who saw it. Another witness contacted the control tower at the Manises Airport, and the latter confirmed that there was an object though unable to say of course what it was. The witnesses said it looked "bigger than a star", and was stationary right above Valencia, at a height greater than an airliner, and emitting silvery flashes. ("Las Provincias" newspaper, Valencia, January 4 1987.)

2. "Red Balls". Puerto de Vitoria (Alava Province, Basque Region, Northern Spain)

In the early hours of May 6, 1987, two "red balls", of the apparent size of handballs. A witness signalled by flashing a torch, whereupon one "ball" flew off rapidly and dropped behind a mountain. At 0.15 a.m. early the next day, another but smaller "red ball" of the same type was seen to emerge from behind a hill and travel vertically straight up into the sky, where it was lost from sight after five or six minutes. The eyewitnesses were four members of a local Basque UFO study group (EUV). The sky was clear at the time and full of stars. (Reported in CIFO Bulletin No. 64, July/ August 1987.)

3. UFO over Murcia Province (S.E. Spain)

On July 30, 1987, a family who were holidaying at Moratalla saw a strange glow in the sky in the direc-

tion of what seemed the area between Cieza and Calasparra. It died down intermittently and then "flared up" again, continuing thus for some time. The time was half-an-hour after midnight. After observing for about half-an-hour they went to bed, but were shortly aroused by a relative who said he had seen a cylindrical object carrying a red light appear from the area in question, and travelling at great speed. This craft, it was claimed, was the source of the "glow". (CIFE Investigation Group's report, August 25, 1987.)

4. Valencia Province, Eastern Coast of Spain (Mediterranean)

Residents of Villareal telephoned to the local newspaper "Mediterráneo" (published at Castellón) to say that in the night of August 24/25, 1987, they had seen a strange luminous object stationary above Almassora. It was of an extraordinary brightness. At about halfan-hour after midnight it began to emit red flashes,

and as time passed these grew brighter and brighter. At times the object seemed to be "like a star", but at other moments witnesses thought it resembled a disc or a ring. When the dawn came on August 25 the object was still there and showed no movement. (Newspaper "Mediterráneo" — Pub. Castellón, August 25, 1987.)

5. UFO reportedly "videoed" in France by boy

In the Loire-Atlantique region of Western France a ten-year-old boy was reported to have got a video picture of a UFO. The boy told officials that, awakened early in the morning by a strange noise, he had opened the window and seen a large oval-shaped glowing and pulsating mass outside. The press report said the video picture was being sent for examination by the GEPAN experts at Toulouse. (Newspaper "El Periódico" (Barcelona), September 11, 1987.)

STAFFORDSHIRE SIGHTINGS OF 1967

In FSR 32/2 (page 24) we mentioned the case of a lady who, when residing in the Hockley-Wilnecote area of Staffordshire, claims to have experienced some strange sightings of unknown objects in the sky, late at night and in the early mornings, over a period of approximately a week. The time was, as she recalls it now, around mid-August 1967.

Mrs D — (name on file), aged 44 at that time, stated that she looked out at the sky through her bedroom window and saw "five twinkly lighted objects." The entire sighting lasted, she estimates, about three hours, ending more or less with the dawn.


To begin with, she observed one large object, "with many bright rings of lights always spinning upwards". Then, in succession, four other, smaller objects arrived. One after the other, these approached the larger object, and seemed, as she says to be "re-charging"(?) "by moving into position above the larger one and then going up and down above it, like some huge spinning-top." This process lasted for several seconds.

After that, the four small objects took up positions in the sky around the large one, as shown in the lady's sketch.

When the dawn began to break in the East, the smaller objects "shot away at terrific speed", and finally the large one did likewise. Throughout the whole of the three-hour period, the larger central object appeared stationary in the sky, while the other four were "flashing and whirring around".

As mentioned already, the witness says that this procedure was seen by her to occur over a period of several nights.

When she told the members of her family what she had seen, on the morning following the first sighting, she says she encountered the usual disbelief, and over the years thereafter she had learned that it was better to keep quiet about what she had seen. She said (addressing her letter to Mr Patrick Moore, "Editor of Flying Saucer Review"), that she now felt emboldened to write about her experience because she had just read an article on UFOs in one of the Sunday tabloid papers.
